
He said that the club's display at the Motor Show will include an early M-type, as well as various 4- and 6-cylinder models - some of which are supercharged.


"Last year's show attracted over 5,000 people – and we're confident that the number will grow again this year, as it has every year.

SAVVA Technical Tip 116 - Getting that shine back

I pulled a car out of the garage after giving it six months rest and was very aware that over the 30 years of it's existence the original white paint had taken on a "yellowish" glow. I was also very aware that no amount of polishing would bring it back to life regardless of what the directions or claim to fame the packaging on the polish tins say. The only way was to strip the top gunk off and re-polish it with a good wax – as the body shops and used car dealers do.

This can be a D.I.Y. task and done by hand but a far more civilized method is to use a fine burnishing compound (often called tooth paste by the trade) and a **slow** speed buff fitted with a foam pad. This is a messy operation so it's best to park in the middle of the lawn and either wear old cloths or go naked.

Modus operandi:

Wash the car to remove dust particles that can scratch the paint surface, then, spread some burnishing compound on the panel you are about to attack, wet the foam pad by dipping it into a bucket of water and keep it wet by occasionally dipping it in the bucket, go over the surface one panel at a time at a slow speed.

Once all the panels have been compounded the car can be washed and a final coat of **good** quality polish applied. Try to use good wax rather than the liquid "quick fix" stuff.

The above has always been a problem for us DIY types as multi speed electric buffing machines are very expensive, however, some manufactures have recently introduced smaller lighter variable speed DIY versions at a much lower price. The professionals would obviously prefer the fancy heavy models but being an amateur I prefer the lighter DIY unit as they are easier to use.



This variable speed buffing machine was purchased for just under R1000.00 and a tube of "tooth paste" at around R100.00. The pads don't last long so buy a couple of replacements also at around R100 each.

SAVVA Technical Tip 117 – Welch Plugs (core plugs)

We once mentioned that overheating problems were invariably caused because of fan belt, water hose, or even thermostat problems. Whilst rebuilding an engine recently I was reminded of another possible problem – rusted and leaking Welch plugs. When did you last look at the Welch plugs on your oldies?

A few years ago I removed an engine from a Sunbeam Rapier, fitted a new clutch assembly, re-attached the gearbox and was about to fit the whole contraption back in the car when a friend came by and posed the question – did you replace the Welch plug at the back of the engine, it's inside the bell housing? Apparently this engine, like so many others, has a plug situated at the back of the engine. It was inside the bell housing which meant re-removing the gearbox, the clutch and pressure plate to get to it. After taking off all the things I had just replaced - there it was for all to see – a rather rusty Welch plug.

The old fashioned "saucer" plugs are getting harder to find so one often has to improvise by using a modern one and cutting most of the lip off and tapping it in with goodly dose of "Indian Head" sealer or some similar goo. If you are a purist and insist on an original type plug may we suggest before removing the old plugs in your engine you find replacements first. If you look around you can still find saucer plugs. It may take a bit of looking but they are out there waiting for you to find them.

Ideally, I know it's easy to talk (write), but if you have the time and ability, the answer is to make a plug out of a piece if brass and it's there for life. I believe some of the mining companies, when having engines rebuilt, stipulate brass Welch plugs. What do they know that we don't know?

P.S. I once had a model T and found a coin fitted perfectly.

SAVVA Technical Tip 118 – 12 volt petrol cut-off valves


We don't often hear about collector cars being stolen however it has happened. Recently, I fitted a 12 volt petrol cut-off valve to a car and thought it may be worth mentioning that such things are available.

Originally they were designed to be part of elaborate security systems and were fitted in-line on the petrol pipe from the petrol tank to the carburettor. They operate on 12 volt and require 12 volts to open them to allow the petrol to flow and no voltage means no petrol flows. To protect our collector cars they can be operated by a hidden switch under the dash or wherever you wish it to be.

They can also be used for other purposes. For example, I recently fitted one to the tank of a little BMW Isetta. These cunning little vehicles had a mechanical tap which fed the carburettor by gravity. However, after 50 years these mechanical taps tended to corrode and leak and are extremely difficult to replace or repair. In this case, the solution was to replace the original tap with one of these electrically operated devices. Nobody in their right minds would think of stealing an Isetta so security wasn't an issue. To operate, I simply connected it to the wire from the ignition switch going to the coil. When the ignition is switched on the valve opens and the petrol flows, when the ignition is switched off – no petrol.

The car security shops keep them in stock and they cost about R150 each. Not much to pay for excellent security.
